UNISON calls for a pay rise of £3,000 or 10% for all local government & school workers

UNISON, GMB and Unite lodged a pay claim for all council and school workers employed on NJC pay in England, Wales and Northern Ireland on Thursday 29 February 2024.

The claim calls for a substantial increase of £3,000 or 10%, whichever is the greater, on all spinal column points, from 1 April 2024.

The **Full Claim** is available on our **pay campaign webpage** and has been submitted to the Employers' Side of the NJC.

The pay claim focuses on the continuing, rising cost of living and the need for a significant pay rise for all local government and school staff. The claim makes clear that poverty pay must be addressed and that a decent pay rise will have a significant impact on enabling employers to recruit and retain the staff they need.

Gearing up for the pay campaign!

The NJC Employers Side will be consulting councils on the pay claim throughout March 2024, before meeting initially in April and then again in May 2024 to consider their response. It is crucial that we maximize political pressure on council and school employers during this period. We need everyone to make it absolutely clear to national and local government employers why a fair and decent pay rise is so vital.

At the same time, we need to build awareness of the NJC pay claim our members, You are vital in building support for the claim and putting our case across to politicians.

We also need to ensure that we put massive pressure on the Government. Local authorities and schools are struggling financially and it is vital that the Government funds employers properly so that they can offer and implement a decent pay increase.

You can start by getting your council to debate and pass this <u>Model motion</u>, supporting our pay claim and calling on the Government to fund it.

3) Ask members, friends and family, to email their councillors explaining why local government and school workers need a pay rise
